TECHNICAL DATA

pH 3.7 TA 5.7 Alc. 14.7% Retail \$58 Cases 150 As has been the case for the previous vintages, The Source stands tall as Copia's flagship wine. Passion-filled manhours are spent each year on being students of Syrah. That effort shines in 2018's The Source. Almost entirely Syrah, the fruit hails from Jespersen Ranch in Edna Valley. The windswept personality of this special site ensures a distinctly cool climate, ocean-kissed Syrah. We think wine reviewer Jeb Dunnuck observes it best when he says, "It has one foot in the Northern Rhône and one foot in the Central Coast."

WINEMAKING

Varietals were handpicked in October and November at the peak of flavor ripeness and phenolic maturity. Grapes were carefully cluster sorted, 100% destemmed and fermented in stainless steel. After a cold maceration, élevage included daily punch-downs, pump-overs and pneumotage. The wine rested for 20 months 56% new French oak. Bottled on June 23, 2020.

TASTING NOTES

The nose is perfumed and heady, dominated by black and blue fruit, hints of animal fat, daffodils, and hyacinths. It's lush on the palate with a spice box element, a touch of cocoa, elegant tannins and a great backbone of acidity. Full bodied with an extended finish, this concentrated wine allows all of the mesmerizing qualities of cool-climate Syrah to shine.
